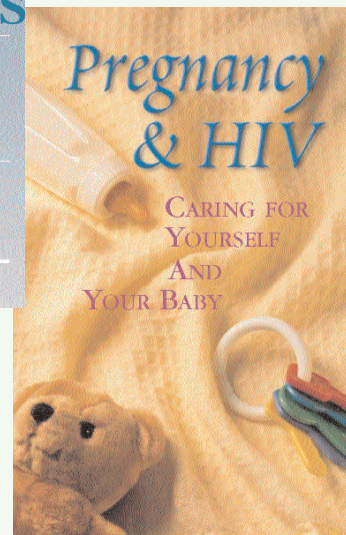
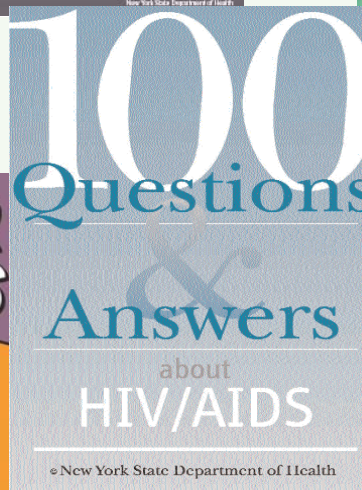
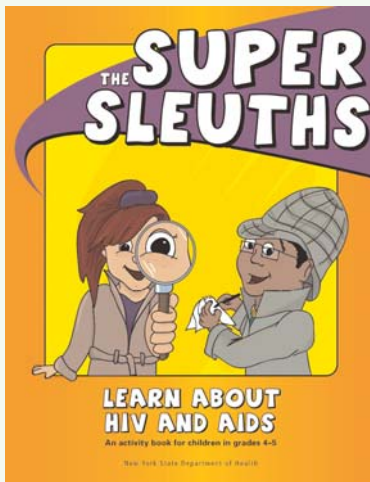

Educational Software for Children Grade 4 through Grade 7

The **Health Works CD-ROM** was created by the New York State Department of Health to help children learn about HIV infection and AIDS. CDs are free of charge to educational and human service agencies in New York State. This software runs on both Windows 3.1, '95 or higher, or Macintosh computer systems.

Children can play four interactive computer games: Hospital, Party, School, and Street Corner. During each animated scene, players are asked how they would respond to situations similar to those they might experience in real life. These questions test their understanding of HIV/AIDS risks and their ability to avoid risky behavior. To get advice before answering any questions, players may enlist the help of one or more advisors: Doctor, Teacher, Clergy, Patient, Friend, or AIDS Hotline. Feedback is provided by a narrator who corrects any mistaken assumptions and points out the danger when a risky choice is made. Positive reinforcement is given for correct answers and choices that support HIV prevention.

Hospital: Emphasizes scientific facts about HIV transmission.

Party: Raises issues of sexual responsibility and AIDS.

School: Focuses on myths of casual transmission.

Street Corner: Stresses the HIV risks of drug use.
